WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

“Let not your heart be troubled” (John 14:1).

It’s very easy for a spouse or a friend to comfort us in a catastrophic situation, “Don’t worry; it’s going to be alright.” It’s very easy to read the words of the apostle Paul, **“Be anxious for nothing”** (Philippians 4:6), when we have an eviction notice in our hand from our landlord. It’s very easy to read the words of our Lord, **“Do not worry [be anxious] about your life”** (Matthew 6:25), when we just heard from our doctor, “You have cancer.”

Yes, it’s way too easy to hear, or read all these soothing words.

Beloved, the real challenge is allowing these words of encouragement and the mandates of Scripture to sink deep in our hearts. The real challenge is can we experience perfect tranquility and a worry-free life in the midst of great turmoil? **Can we trust the Lord completely when things have fallen apart?**

Think of it, all along the Lord has been there for His disciples. He has demonstrated, time after time, that He’s the Messiah, the God-Man. He has done those things that only God could have done to prove His deity. Moreover, His disciples had seen Him feed a multitude with only **“five loaves and two fish”** (Matthew 14:17-20). His disciples have seen Him calm the stormy sea, and rescues them from drowning (Mark 4:39). He had helped them pay their temple taxes (Matthew 17:27). He had taught them God’s Word and how to pray effectively (Luke 11:1-13). Surely, He had been there for them in every sense. No wonder they felt so secured with Him. More than that, they had grown to be very comfortable around Him. We ask, “Who could have asked for more?”

But suddenly at supper He announced, **“HE WHO EATS MY BREAD HAS LIFTED HIS HEEL AGAINST ME...one of you will betray Me”** (John 13:18, 21). If that’s not enough to cause their heart to pine away, He added, **“Where I go, you cannot follow Me now”** (v. 36).

Let’s put on their shoes for a moment. Everything has been going so well for us; our bills are paid on time, no health problems; all our dreams have come true. Simply we are on top of the world. Unexpectedly, bad news begins to roll in, one after another. Our investment and savings are wiped out. We have no job, no money to live on, and literally no one to turn to for help. On top of all this, we receive the news everyone dreads from a physician: **“You have cancer.”** What a state of shock that would be!

That’s the same state the Lord’s disciples where in at the Last Supper! When the Lord broke the heartbreaking news that He’s about to leave them, they were in shock beyond words! While they were pondering and considering, what’s next? Who would care for us? Where do we go from here? Christ, who had been where they were, a Man of sorrow, a Man who had travelled their road way before them (Hebrews 2:14-18), zoomed right in with these soul-soothing words of exhortation, **“Let not your heart be troubled.”**

My beloved, that’s the prescription for a troubled heart, **“Let not your heart be troubled.”**

The question is, will you take the pill from the hand of the very One who is at the helm of your life's journey?

Will you drink it with absolute confidence knowing that you are secured in the palm of the hand of the all-knowing, all-wise, all-powerful God? That He cares for you. Will you tell your heart to be calm that God knows what He is doing in your life? If you have lost everything, or are laid off, or diagnosed with cancer, can you have the same confidence Job had when he lost everything and was struck with the most horrible disease? Can you say like Job *"But He knows the way I take [He certainly knows why I am in this horrible state]; When He [the all-knowing God] has tried [and refined] me, I shall come forth as gold"* (Job 23:10)? He will see me through no matter what!

Will you tell your heart to be calm that God knows what He is doing in your life?

Listen: the Lord never promised us anywhere in Scripture that our spiritual journey would be a bed of roses. On the contrary, He said, *"These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world"* (John 16:33). These were His words to His disciples. To the extent that you are going through tough times is proof that He keeps His Word. If your present suffering validates John 16:33, you can hold Him to His other promises,

"Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). ***"I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU"*** (Hebrews 13:5). Though, He went away from His disciples; He never ever took His eyes off of them, not even for a second! The apostle Paul summed up his own experience, *"At my first defense no one supported me... all deserted me... But the Lord stood with me and strengthened me"* (2 Timothy 4:16-17).

So let this sobering truth sink deep in your soul: God will not let go of you until His plan for your life carries a stamp of completion: **GOD'S PLAN IS FULFILLED**, *"For David, after he had served the purpose of God in his own generation, fell asleep, and was laid among his fathers and underwent decay"* (Acts 13:36). David had a life of up and down experiences, but God, in His faithfulness, kept him alive until his life carried God's stamp of completion!

It boils down to this:

No disease has enough pathogen, to shorten your life, until God's plan for your life runs its course! It's that simple! That's GOOD NEWS! So massage your soul with His promise:

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are Mine! 'When you pass through the waters [of suffering], I will be with you; And through the rivers [of extreme hardship], they will not overflow you. When you walk through the fire [of economic disaster], you will not be scorched, Nor will the flame burn you. 'For I am the LORD your God, The Holy One of Israel, your Savior.... 'You are precious in My sight" (Isaiah 43:1-4).

KING DAVID, A SYMPHONY OF GOD'S GRACE

Let us pick up from where we left off. We left Saul at Ramah, where he went in pursuit of David. There, God caused him to prophesy, to the point that he forgot why he went there in the first place. *"He prophesied before Samuel and lay down naked all that day and all that night"* (1 Samuel 19:24). Did I hear someone say, "God has a good sense of humor?" Yes, He does! Listen: It's the worst kind of arrogance for anyone to think that he can alter the plan of God. Job recognized this truth long before Saul, *"no purpose of Yours can be thwarted"* (Job 42:2). Sadly, Saul never grasped this truth; and even if he had in the past, the flood of prolonged carnality had flushed it out of his soul. What a miserable state to live in—a state devoid of divine viewpoint thinking! That's where we left him. We turn over to a new page.

Saul's Anger against Jonathan

"Then Saul's anger burned against Jonathan [Saul's son] and he said to him, 'You son of a perverse, rebellious woman!... For as long as [David] the son of Jesse lives on the earth, neither you nor your kingdom will be established. Therefore now, send and bring him to me, he must surely die'" (1 Samuel 20:30a, 31).

"He must surely die" were the words of a believer in perpetual carnality. Saul had allowed his soul to be saturated with the poison of self-centeredness,

egocentrism, bitterness and the venom of animosity. His antagonism was geared toward David and everyone around him. He constantly thought of no one but himself.

Anyone who opposed him, even his son, was the object of his wrath. That's right. When his son, Jonathan, objected to his behavior, "Saul hurled his spear at him to strike him down" (v. 33). He blasted his son, "**You son of a perverse, rebellious woman!**" Interesting! If Jonathan was the "son of perverse," that would make Saul, "king Perverse." The picture we seek to paint here is a picture of a soul without the life of God. My beloved, this is not a comfortable zone. The price of perpetual carnality is huge!

The reality is that when a believer loses touch with the life of God, he becomes a tool in the hands of the evil one. There's no sin too small or too great on Satan's menu. That's the condition in which Saul found himself. He had no spiritual vitality. He had no peace. He had no joy. All he had was misery and thirst for murder! He was a weapon in Satan's hand! Beloved, this is a dreadful position for any born-again believer. There can be no normal life for anyone without the life of God in operation! There's no way of getting around it!

The reality is that when a believer loses touch with the life of God, he becomes a tool in the hands of the evil one.

Saul was hoping to get rid of David so that he could keep Israel's kingdom in Saul's family. But not a chance; for God had spoken! David will and must be the next king of Israel. It's that simple! When God speaks, a roundtable discussion is unwarranted! David echoed, "Let all the earth fear the LORD; Let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him. **For He spoke and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast. The LORD nullifies the counsel of the nations; He frustrates the plans of the peoples. The counsel of the LORD stands forever, The plans of His heart from generation to generation**" (Psalm 33:8-11).

Saul should have known better. He should have known that his son, Jonathan, had reverence for God as we shall see in a moment. But first, let's examine Saul's father-to-son talk, a reality check:

"For as long as the son of Jesse lives on the earth, neither you nor your kingdom will be established. Therefore now, send and bring him to me, for he must surely die" (1 Samuel 20:31).

In other words, "Son, what I am doing is for your own good. If we team up, we can send David to his early grave and keep the kingdom for you." What a mouth-watering temptation! Who wouldn't want royalty? Anybody would except one who had realized that being a king was not God's plan for his life. Jonathan realized that. What an exceptional believer!

Jonathan's Integrity

Integrity is a familiar word to all of us. It echoes throughout Scripture. For example, David wrote, "I shall walk in my integrity" (Psalm 26:11). Solomon answered, "The just man walketh in his integrity" (Proverbs 20:7 KJV). But what is it? Integrity is synonymous with spiritual maturity; it's the same as "love for God." It's a lifestyle of enduring devotion, guarded by unsurpassed love and a constant obedience to the mandates of Scripture, today, tomorrow and the next. Such a lifestyle allows God's Word to take precedent over whatever the world offers—no matter how juicy the offer. Saul offered his son, the kingdom of Israel at the expense of David's death. But Jonathan feared God! His integrity insulated him from taking part in that which God does not approve.

Jonathan knew that God was preparing David for a greater height, for "he was prospering greatly" (1 Samuel 18:15). He knew that God would ultimately transfer Saul's kingdom to David. So in his integrity he was not jealous, or envious that the kingdom would go to someone else, other than himself. He simply accepted God's will. Assured of the kingdom transfer, he said to his friend, David, "may the Lord be with you as he was with my father" (1 Samuel 20:13). He added, "If I am still alive, will you not show me the lovingkindness of the Lord?" (v. 14). He signed off on his assurance of the kingdom transfer with a covenant, "You shall not cut off your lovingkindness from my house forever, not even when the LORD cuts off every one of the enemies of David from the face of the earth." So Jonathan made a covenant with the house of David" (vv. 15-16).

There we have it; integrity magnified! Jonathan never took part in his father's conspiracy. Rather, he revealed to David, his father's plan to kill him (vv. 31-38).

What integrity!

Reading such a story, sends chills through my spine. I am sure it does the same thing to you. Here's a young man who knew that David was in a better position to take the kingdom away from him; and yet he never showed one iota of bitterness. Instead, he prayed for David, *“may the Lord be with you as he was with my father.”* My beloved, before we take on another portion of work for dissection, it's of paramount importance that we pause and re-examine our own lives. If the Bible was to be re-written, and each of us was entitled to a page, what would the content be? Could somebody read it and say, “Wow! This is God reflected in a human form?” If not, what are we doing as Christians? These questions bring this segment to a close, and open another with David's spiritual failure.

David's Spiritual Failure

What an irony! What a paradox! We have just wrapped up a beautiful testimony of Jonathan's spiritual integrity, only to open another page of David's spiritual failure. The Bible has nothing to hide. It is not prejudiced. It tells it as it is, the good, the bad, and the ugly. David committed two sins worthy of consideration in this section. First: he lied to a priest. Second: he faked insanity to a king. We consider this section very pivotal to our study. Before we examine David's failures, it's of paramount importance that we take a break, back up a bit and take a brief look at spiritual failure.

Spiritual Failure

Spiritual failure is anything that falls short of God's righteous standard. Make no mistake; no one is immune to spiritual failure, not even spiritual giants. We fail in every level of our spiritual lives. We fail as spiritual babes. We fail as spiritual adolescents. We fail as spiritual adults. This is a fact of the spiritual life. It's self deception to think that a believer can be sinless perfection. Not in this life. **“Indeed, there is not a righteous man on earth who continually does good and who never sins”** (Ecclesiastes 7:20; cf. 1 John 1:8-10). **“We all stumble in many ways”** (James 3:2). If sin does not trap us mentally (what we think), it traps us overtly (what we do); and if it fails mentally and overtly, it wages an all out war to trap us with our tongues (what we say), *“no one can tame the tongue”* (v. 8). My beloved, it's because of God's grace in respect to our failures that Scripture records a tough question for us, *“If You, LORD, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand?”* (Psalm 130:3).

Nobody! **“But there is forgiveness with You”** (v.4). Thank God for that! Grace highlighted!

The problem with Christianity today is not spiritual failure as such; the real problem is irresponsibility. Many of us are careless with our spiritual lives. We don't pay attention to what we think. We don't pay attention to what we do. We don't pay attention to what comes out of our mouths.

As a result, we come short of having the mental *attitude...which was also in Christ Jesus*” (Philippians 2:5); we come short of being *“imitators of God as beloved children”* (Ephesians 5:1); we come short of letting our *“speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that... [we] will know how... [we] should respond to each person”* (Colossians 4:6). Therein is the tragedy of Christianity today!

Spiritual failure reveals our level of seriousness with God's plan for our lives. Apathy to God's plan is a way of life for a believer in perpetual carnality (1 Corinthians 3:1-3). Failure awakens a growing believer, and causes him to *“be of sober spirit”* (1 Peter 5:8). What's more, because of the matured believer's *“love for God,”* spiritual failure sends a shock wave to his spine, and causes him not only to *“be of sober spirit”* (1 Peter 5:8), but more so, to be careful not repeat the same failure. He dreads shaming the name of the One he loves dearly. Realizing that he is the 5th Gospel, the nearest Scripture, *“a fragrance of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing”* (2 Corinthians 2:15), a growing or a mature believer takes every step to recover (1 John 1:9) and moves on.

We all fail. But, spiritual failure is something we should not take casually; for it comes with a price, divine discipline (Hebrews 12:6; cf. 1 Corinthians 11:30; Proverbs 10:27). Many think that 1 John 1:9, *“If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness”* is a license to sin. Some say, “All you need to do is commit the sin of your lust and confess it afterwards.” May I say to you as God's minister: **a premeditated sinful act is a deliberate insult to God's justice that carries a warning label.** **“YOU SHALL NOT PUT THE LORD YOUR GOD TO THE TEST”** (Matthew 4:7; cf. Deuteronomy 6:16). Failure is a reminder that we are still trapped inside the coat of our Sin Nature. But that does not exonerate us in our spiritual failures. Remember, **“FOR THOSE WHOM THE LORD LOVES HE DISCIPLINES AND HE SCOURGES EVERY SON WHOM HE RECEIVES”** (Hebrews 12:6).

With this in mind let us now examine the first of David’s two failures in our passage.

David Lied to a Priest

Fear is our worst enemy in the spiritual arena. It knocks down truth in a hurry! It was fear that gripped Abraham and impelled him to ask his wife to lie in order to save his life (Genesis 12:11-13). After David ran from Saul, he went to a city called *Nob*, and there he met up with “*Ahimelech, the priest*” (1 Samuel 21:1).

Ahimelech was surprised to see David, and he asked, “*Why are you alone and no one with you?*” (v. 1). David was caught off guard: Lie or tell the truth? He lied.

David said to Ahimelech the priest, ‘The king has commissioned me with a matter and has said to me, ‘Let no one know anything about the matter on which I am sending you and with which I have commissioned you; and I have directed the young men to a certain place’ (v. 2).

We do not condone David’s failure. Many factors, such as fear, may have played a role in putting him on the spot to lie. Whatever the reasons were, the bottom line is that David lied “*to Ahimelech the priest.*” Does it mean we can live a lifestyle of lying because David lied? God forbid! Remember, **a pre-meditated sinful act is a deliberate insult to God’s justice that carries a warning label.** Before you ever think of putting God to the test, consider what happened in the Garden. Eve was deceived; but Adam willfully sinned. In response, God made Adam the sole head of human race, “*In Adam all die*” (1 Corinthians 15:22).

Furthermore, Scripture warns, “*Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under-foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace?*” (Hebrews 10:28-29).

Someone asks, “Was David’s sin premeditated, or was he caught off guard?” We do not know. Scripture reveals David’s premeditated sin in 2 Samuel 11. The price for that sin was heavy! We shall scrutinize his ultimate failure later. Suffice it to say, David’s spiritual failure highlights two things. One: no one is immune to failure. Two: God’s grace!

David failed, but God’s grace was not retracted. He never lost his title, “**a man after...God’s own heart**” (1 Samuel 13:14). He simply ran into a bump and stumbled. We do this all the time in our spiritual walk. We stumble frequently as spiritual babes. We stumble less frequently in our spiritual adolescence. In spiritual adulthood, we seldom stumble. That’s the difference!

You can always measure your spiritual life by taking a quick test. Ask yourself, “How often do I stumble?” Frequently? Less frequently? Or seldom? Another way we can measure our spiritual life is this: Does it grieve you when you fall short of God’s mark for your life? For baby believers, there is no grievance over their spiritual failures (1 Corinthians 3:1-3, cf. 5:1-5). For growing believers, there’s a degree of grievance in their soul when they stumble. And for mature believers, they certainly grieve within whenever they realize that they have failed the One, who has done so much for them.

The good news is that God’s grace is greater than our failure, no matter the magnitude! Realizing this, we should never allow our spiritual failure to weigh us down and keep us from moving forward. We should

always apply the recovery procedure of 1 John 1:9 when we fail. It works all the time, when properly applied, “*If we confess our sins [all known sins], He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our [known] sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness [unknown sins]*” This is grace in action! You ask, “Did David confess the sin of his lie?” One would think that he did. He was familiar with the Mosaic Law, and the consequences of sins, and the remedy thereof. He later wrote after his adulterous behavior, “*I acknowledged my sin to You, And my iniquity I did not hide; I said, ‘I will confess my transgressions to the LORD’; And You forgave the guilt of my sin*” (Psalm 32:5).

Studying the life of David and the many facets of God’s grace upon his life is very fascinating! We look forward to examining his second sin and more. We can’t wait to continue our task of tracing David’s footprints as he journeyed, pace-by-pace, slowly, but surely, en route to the Royal Palace, where he was crowned Israel’s next king.

“Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen.”
